## **BPHC Policy Guidance Promising Practices**

REMINDER: If you observe a Promising Practice(s) that you wish to include in your report, please be sure to document it while on site. Below is the Promising Practices process and helpful tips for your review. ## **BPHC Promising Practices Process:**

• **Definition:** A promising practice refers to an activity, procedure, approach or policy that leads to, or is likely to lead to, improved outcomes or increased efficiency for health centers.

Promising Practice Identification (by consultants) Current Status:

- Context SUCCESSFUL
- Description SUCCESSFUL
- Replicability SUCCESSFUL
- Outcome IMPROVEMENT NEEDED

#### • Do's and Don'ts:

- 1. DO look for Promising Practices, especially when a health center is virtually completely compliant. We want to share them!
- DO check the Compliance Manual to be sure that what appears to be a Promising Practice is not a Program Requirement. An improvement of, addition to, or activity surrounding a Program Requirement can be identified as a Promising Practice, but not an actual Program Requirement.
- 3. DO state how results are being measured.
- 4. DO state the source(s) of information for results.
- 5. DO include results, or anticipated results (depending on the Promising Practice's stage of implementation), showing evidence that the Promising Practice produces/will produce positive change(s), such as a specific (or reasonably projected) increase in patients, decrease in backlog or other desired outcome(s).
- 6. DON'T include a practice that has not been implemented yet.

## OSV Federal Representative

There will be a Federal Representative present on all Operational Site Visits. Once the pre-site call takes place, there should be no further communication with the Project Officer of record (this includes cc's on emails). Should any challenges or concerns arise relative to the site visit, please be sure to address them with the assigned Federal Representative.

#### OSV Structured Technical Assistance Report

There have been several inquiries regarding immediate access to the OSV report template/Site Visit Protocol upon confirmation of site visit. Please note that consultant access will be available one (1) week prior to the site visit start date.

#### Site Visit Report Writing Style Guide

The Site Visit Report Writing Style Guide was developed to provide direction and support for MSCG consultant experts, BPHC staff and contractors when writing, editing, and revising documents for BPHC, specifically site visit reports for the Health Center Program. It includes information on appropriate usage of vocabulary and grammar commonly found in BPHC documents and ensures that writers use these items consistently throughout all materials. It also provides guidance on how to refer to various aspects of the Health Center Program and how to use key terms unique to BPHC. The MSCG-BPHC Writing Style Guide is intended to build on and/or supplement Departmental and Agency writing standards and requirements and should be used in conjunction with these resources. This guide also provides information on creating PowerPoint slides, as well as resources on writing in plain language.
